About My Ministry

Currently, I am serving as the Chaplain Coordinator for the Metro Nashville Police Department (MNPd). I have been a Metro Nashville Police Officer for 14 years, and I've been in Christian ministry for more than 20 years.

In 2013, I became a Chaplain and Peer Supporter with the MNPd in addition to my regular duties as an officer. These roles opened new opportunities for me to minister to the citizens of Nashville through death notifications and to minister to my fellow officers through pastoral support.

In 2021, I became the full-time Chaplain Coordinator of the MNPd Volunteer Chaplain Program. My responsibilities still include delivering death notifications and providing pastoral support to my fellow officers, but I am also responsible for leading the chaplain program forward.
