# **About My Ministry**

We were presented with the opportunity to go to a small town, in Bristol, R.I., to partner with what was then a new NAMB church plant, Mount Hope Church (MHC). In May of 2019, we moved to partner in ministry with MHC. And then in the summer of 2024, the Lord led us to discern a call for me to become the new lead pastor at Grace Community Chapel in Seekonk, Mass.
