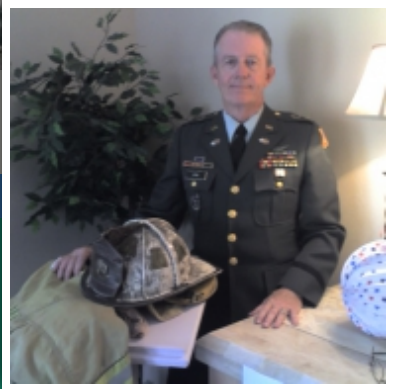

About My Ministry

Our Disciple of Jesus (DoJ) Halfway House for ex-inmates, men and women, and indigent veterans program provides long-term—six months to one year—transitional shelter, supervision and employment assistance. To help them return as productive members of society, we help develop their social skills and instill a sense of responsibility by offering training and education of secular and religious content. Client residents are required to pay rent as soon as we help them gain employment.
