Residents speak more than 140 languages and dialects and, remarkably, more than half of the population are immigrants from all over the world who have settled in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA), making it one of the world's most diverse places to live and work.

According to the Durham region census published in 2016, there is a population of 645,862 in Oshawa, which is located on the east side of Toronto, where more than 7 percent of the dwellers are Spanish speakers and most nonbelievers.
