### **About My Church Plant**

Lebanon, III., is a rural town of 4,500 people outside of St. Louis. From the first time Makenzie and I visited, we fell in love. The more we got to know Lebanon, we understood that it is a city in need of a true gospel-centered, missional church. On the city of Lebanon website, you will find 12 churches listed. To date, only six of those are active, which means there is currently one church for about every 750 to 1,000 residents (including college students).

Lebanon is home to McKendree University and students are from 41 states and 38 countries. Since our first conversation with a Lebanon resident that ended with her saying, "We need you here," we have continued to grow in knowledge of what the people of Lebanon really need. Lebanon needs a church who truly loves the city and provides a sense of belonging to isolated people.
