About My Ministry

I serve as an SBC-endorsed Chaplain Major with the 118th Wing, Tennessee Air National Guard in Nashville, Tenn. As a traditional guardsman, I have mostly served in a drill status of one weekend a month, two weeks a year during my 10.5 year career.

I deployed outside of the continental U.S. (OCONUS) in 2018 and was activated as the mission chaplain for the East Tennessee Region during the COVID-19 pandemic to support both Army and Air National Guard personnel working at testing and vaccination sites and hospitals from April 2020 to September 2021. I was also activated from October 2021 to September 2022 in support of global operations at the 118th. A chapel renovation that coordinated led to the baptism of six airmen and family members at our unit.
