I was 11 years old when I was saved and baptized at 17.

Thirteen years later on May 22, 1998, after I finished my bachelor's degree in theology at the Christian University of North Haiti, Jesus called me to be the senior pastor of Romeo Baptist Church in Haiti. I have worked at this church as senior pastor for 10 years. I left this church to come to the USA to follow my studies.

I met my wife in high school and got married when she was in college. We have six children (five girls and one boy).

About My Church Plant

God called me into the ministry when I was 24 years old. After I got my degree at Landmark Baptist College, I moved to Las Vegas, Nev., to help the Haitian community there. In 2023, I met pastor James at the Renaissance Church where I served the Lord faithfully. Renaissance Church became my sending church months later.

Since 2019, I have been praying to God for two things—a mother church and in which direction I should head to plant a church. He answered my prayers first with the location of Georgia and second with Renaissance Church located in Las Vegas, whom I thank for their support and their acceptance with open arms.
