About My Church Plant

I currently work as a full time missionary to the Tohono O'odham (TO) Nation, which is the second largest reservation in the country. Fewer than 1 percent of people on the TO Nation are Christians.

Our vision is to see every community have consistent access to the gospel. We work toward that vision by planting churches, leading Bible studies, hosting missions teams and meeting needs in various ways.

My main roles in our ministry are teaching children, discipling teenage girls and leading evangelistic Bible studies.
