feel called to help reach the people of Montpelier and its surrounding communities with the gospel of Christ. We do this by having weekly gatherings on Thursday evenings where we eat dinner together, worship together and have Bible study. We now rent space from Christ Church in downtown Montpelier. One Thursday a month all of us worship together while on the other Thursdays the adults and children meet separately for Bible study. I help teach the older children.

We also serve in the community. We started a playgroup called Little Explorers on Tuesday mornings in October of 2016. It is well attended, and we are still seeing new faces each week. We have planned large-scale community events, such as a Halloween carnival in 2015 and the Family Olympics on July 3, 2016. We also participate in missions projects, such as Operation Christmas Child. Missions teams have come to help with the third of July event, serve in the local elementary and high schools and provide vacation Bible school in the summer. The main focus of our ministry is building relationships with people that leads to sharing the gospel and seeing people transformed by God's love and grace, equipping them to share the gospel with others, too.
