I also equip believers in Christ to witness, build gospel sharing relationships with people from countries where Christ is not known, and make disciples of Jesus who make disciples of Jesus. I also do refugee ministry to people from a war-torn country —my family and I lived in one many years ago—sharing the gospel and helping them.
