In early 2015, the launch team began regular outreach in the community with a booth at the community Easter festival, prayerwalking, door-to-door canvass witnessing, serving at the community's Independence Day festival, VBS in a park and evangelistic Bible studies at a local business. We were in the application process of renting a local school gym for Sunday services that we had hoped to launch in September 2015. But in August 2015, a closing church gave us their building and merged with us.
