Their target neighborhood of Blatchford is a new city development on what was formerly a municipal airport site adjacent to downtown, where developers expect more than 30,000 brand new residents in an area completely unchurched.

This community is at a social-economic and multiethnic crossroads and is close to major post-secondary institutions and places of influence. They are praying that Supper Club will be an intentional community of people who are dedicated to showing and sharing the love of Jesus by inviting their neighbors to a physical and spiritual meal.
