About the Family

I grew up in Birmingham, Ala., and attended Samford University. After spending two summers in Alaska through the North American Mission Board's summer missions program, I moved to Alaska where I took a ministry position. There I met Amy, and we married in 2005. About My Church Plant

We moved to Boston in July 2018, and I began a church planting residency with City on a Hill Church. Through this residency and Send Network training, the Lord led us to plant a church in the Jamaica Plan Neighborhood of Boston, near the Forest Hills train station. Four Boston neighborhoods converge here.

There are more than 25,000 people within walking distance of Forest Hills and the area continues to grow with numerous housing developments bringing thousands of new residents over the next few years. The neighborhood is a mix of old Boston, immigrants and young urban professionals. Our vision is to bridge these different people groups so people from every culture will follow Jesus as King for the good of Boston!
